There are some famous (or at least well-known) people in this tree. I hesitate to say that I am actually related to them, since the connections are a little obscure.


For instance:

Madame Marie Curie is the mother-in-law of husband of sister-in-law of niece of husband of sister-in-law of aunt of husband of aunt of husband of 1st cousin 1x removed of husband of aunt of husband of my 1st cousin 1x removed. Whew!

Edward C Clark, who, as a founder of the Singer Sewing Machine Company along with Isaac Singer, amassed a considerable family fortune, was the great grandfather of husband of niece of husband of sister-in-law of aunt of husband of aunt of husband of 1st cousin 1x removed of husband of aunt of husband of my 1st cousin 1x removed. That's 35 people you have to get through to get from him to me, and if I recall correctly the connection is only made through at least one second marriage, which makes it even more difficult to call him a true relative. Trust me, I wish I had a closer connection to the people who founded the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown. How cool would that be?


George Washington's connection is a little more streamlined (yes, THAT George). He is the 2nd great grand uncle of wife of my husband's 2nd great grandfather. But even that connection involves a half-sibling's connection to George's sister. I didn't even notice I had our first President in the tree until someone else pointed it out to me.

Another President in the tree is **Grover Cleveland**, the 22nd and 24th US President. Stephen Grover Cleveland (1837-1908) is the third cousin 3 times removed of my husband. But he is also my 5th cousin 4x removed. I discovered that my husband's tree and mine both contained Aaron Cleveland and his wife Abiah Hyde, who are the great-grandparents of President Cleveland. The Hydes are in my husband's family, the Clevelands are relatives of my grandmother.
